Indoor Activities:

- Grab a magazine or newspaper and let your child cut out images that they like and let them make a collage out the pieces they cut out. Materials: scissors, white paper, and glue.

Math:

- Parents grab white paper and write a number on it. So, on one page write #1 and on another #2, #3, #4, and #5 so far, and draw circles or squares that correspond to the number. After lying it around your house and have your child go look for toys and categorize based on the number on the paper. (see picture) Focuses on counting and number recognition.

Science: Lemon Volcanoes

- Materials: Lemon, Lemon juice (from 1 or 2 other lemons), baking soda, popsicle sticks, and a tray or dish. Food coloring and dish soap is optional (but fun)
 1. Prep the lemon by rolling it on the counter. This will help loosen the juice inside.
 2. Parent cut the bottom of the lemon to make it flat. This helps the Lemon to make it stand be careful not too cut too much or else you will have a leaky volcano.
 3. Parent then cut into the top of the Lemon to make a hole. This is now your volcano.
 4. Place the volcano onto your tray. Use the popsicle stick to squish the Lemon pulp to release the juice. Scrape the sides along the Lemon but try not to puncture the bottom.
 5. (optional) Squeeze a few drops of dish soap into your volcano. This isn't necessary but it will make your volcano bubbly. You can also add food coloring to add a little extra.

6. A teaspoon of baking soda to the Lemon to activate your volcano. Watch it foam up and come to life!!
7. Use the popsicle stick to mix the Lemon juice up a little more. Sprinkle in more baking soda once your volcano slows down. You can keep adding more juice to reactivate your volcano after it settles down. Have fun experimenting with baking soda & Lemons.

Outdoor Activities:

- Go on a “yellow” nature walk. Find things that are yellow.
