
Facts about Frogs

A group of frogs is called an army.



A group of eggs is called a frogspawn.



They typically lay their eggs in the water. The eggs hatch into tadpoles.

Their vision field is almost 360° so they can see all that is around

them all the time!



Their eyeballs assist them in swallowing food - they push the food down their throat by pushing down the eyeballs.



They catch their pray with their tongue. Tadpoles have no lungs, they have gills. They grow lungs before they mature into a frog.

They need to live near water as their skin must constantly be moist. If it dries out the frog dies.



Frogs can hibernate. In extreme conditions they can also enter a state called torpor which can last for months.



They breathe through the nose and their skin.

Their call is called a croak.
