

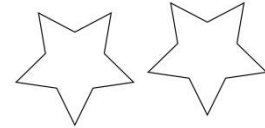
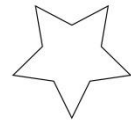


# **Musical Matching Game!**



This weeks' music at home activity is to make a musical matching game.

- 1) Cut pieces of paper into squares.
- 2) On one side draw a character or symbol that represents a familiar song
- 3) Here are some examples to get you started. Add on more of your child's favorites
  - a. Draw a yellow bus for the song "The Wheels on the Bus"
  - b. Draw a barn for the song "Old MacDonald had a Farm"
  - c. Draw a star for "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star"
  - d. Draw a spider for "The Itsy Bitsy Spider"
  - e. Draw a dog for "B-I-N-G-O"
- 4) If you don't feel confident in your drawing skills simply find a picture in an old magazine and cut it out and glue it on the square of paper. OR see if your child wants to draw the picture to represent the song (and write the name of the song under the picture if you want to).
- 5) Add squares for as many songs as you have favorite songs to sing. You can add to your collection over the weeks ahead as well!
- 6) Draw the same symbol on TWO squares of paper for EACH song since this is a matching game.
- 7) Place the squares face down on a table or the floor.
- 8) Mix up the squares.
- 9) Turn over a square (leave it facing up) and sing the song while taking turns turning over more squares until you find the match for the first one.
- 10) Repeat for another song! Do this as many times as your child wants to.



**Extension:** teach a new song in this same way – add a new song or two that your child doesn't know, and let this be an opportunity to teach them something new.
